A total of eleven souls were able to attend the Odessa Senior High camp this year from Salem, Oregon, and all were blessed in tremendous measure by the gifts of God. Michael Livingston, Sydni Williams, Melissa Clark and Vitaliy Surov were the four youth attending as campers, and below is a compilation of their shared testimonies from this blessed week.

It is always a pleasure to be able to attend the Odessa Hills Sr. High camp in Missouri. This year our youth made more efforts in preparation than in previous years, and I truly believe that we were blessed by it. This youth camp was probably one of the best youth camps I have been to. My first testimony from camp was seeing my good friend Marley who had previously been unable to attend due to foot surgery. I was very thankful to God in answering my prayers. I really felt that the whole

camp was unified early on and I knew it was going to be a great week. In one of Brian Herren's classes, we were taught that we have anchors to the world and how it keeps us from the fullness of God. He then had us tie a rope with a golf ball on the end around our ankles representing our sins as anchors to the world. We had to wear them 24/7 until the evening chats the next night. These golf balls soon became our worst enemies, and we realized how ridiculous it is to keep our sins. Either we make the sin fit into our lives or we complain about those around us and how their sin gets in our way when we have our own to worry about behind us. We also came to the realization of how dirty sin could make us feel. That Tuesday evening chats could not have come quicker, and we all quietly went one by one to pray with a counselor and get our anchors of the world cut off from us. We then made our way to the pool, which was the fullness, where Brian told us the time is now and we must not procrastinate any longer he said, "Now jump in and fully give yourself to God, come as you are." At first, I thought that he was joking but after he said that I saw Robert Gillam just dive in, then Brian jumped in and right after, I followed clothes and all, and then we all jumped in. We had not been told to prepare to be wet so we were all in our normal clothing, but that is what made it so awesome. When I came up, I literally felt as light as a feather. It felt amazing. This experience has taught me what it feels like to be forgiven. I will always remember this because I personally always want to feel that way. I learned so much from that experience and it furthered the unity of the camp very early in the week, and it only built from there.

We also had the wonderful blessing of having our sister Lauren White be able to attend. Lauren had cancer, which almost took her before camp, but her heart yearned to be there and because of the prayers that were offered up on her behalf, God allowed her to come one last time. Lauren was able to share her testimony before she had to leave due to her weakening body, and I felt in my heart that it would be the last time I saw her. She then passed on to her reward a few days later, but I will never forget the power of prayer or her testimony that will live on.



Youth Commission Policies 2015

by the 2015 Youth Commission, subject to change by future commissions

Funding youth camps:

- Regional camps are the first priority to support and raise funds for.
- Outside camps are a special privilege, an additional opportunity after committing to attend the regional camp.
- Funds raised for outside camps will only go towards 1 senior high camp, 1 junior high camp or 1 junior camp that has previously been approved and supported by the youth commission.
- Outside junior high and junior camps require an adult chaperone to accompany them.
- Funds will be raised in an effort to help ease the burden of airfare and camp costs, but we do not necessarily expect to cover all costs for outside camps.
- Money is ultimately the responsibility of the parents.

How money is disbursed from fundraisers:

- Funds are awarded to campers according to their individual labor.
- Most activities include an hourly rate determined from the total funds raised at that event (after any costs are subtracted).
- Records of each camper's hours of participation are kept and calculated for each event.
- Some events may not require an hourly rate and funds may be distributed evenly.
- When camp funds are met for a particular camper, they are expected and encouraged to continue participating in all fundraising events, but their earnings will no longer be calculated.
- Any funds made in excess beyond camp needs will be left to Pastoral discretion, and not redistributed to individuals.


Dates and Deadlines:

- Records of individual earnings, dates for all available (approved) camps, and estimated costs will be given to each family by February 1st oeach family knows the current standing of their children's earnings.
- Commitment to attend regional and outside camps must be made clear to the youth commission by March 1st, as at that time plane tickets will be bought for outside camps.
- Fundraising events will continue through May each year to offset as much cost as possible and will be added to the records of each camper.
- ♦ All payment for camps not fully funded is due on June 1st to the Branch Treasurer. Questions and concerns may be brought to the Branch Pastor.

Camper participation guidelines:

- ♦ Lambs of Zion ages range from Kindergarten through 5th grade.
- ♦ Builders and Climbers ages range from 5th grade graduates through the summer of their high school graduating year.
- 5th graders are welcome to fundraise throughout the year with the Builders and Climbers in order to fund camps they are eligible to attend after they graduate the 5th grade.
- Graduating seniors are welcome to attend camps and participate in youth activities through the summer after they graduate.
